support to address health and social issues faced by our clients and their families, as a result of brain injury; visiting clients in hospital, in their homes, providing telephone support, and support group meetings across all localities in Essex.

CEO'S MESSAGE FROM JOANNA WRIGHT



Happy New Year to all our readers!

Happy New Year and thank you to everyone for your support over what turned out to be a very challenging year for everyone.

Coronavirus disrupted our lives and our plans, but we were determined it would not stop us in our tracks. I am so proud of how the team at Headway Essex rallied to respond and adapt to new ways of working to ensure we could continue to support our clients with their health, wellbeing and development needs. I would also like to thank our service users who embraced the new ways to engage with us and each other. And to all our supporters and the grant providers who responded so quickly and generously to help in our hour of need.

My heart goes out to all those who have had COVID and my condolences to those who have lost loved ones. It may not be the best start to the New Year

we could have hoped for but as I reflect over the last 10 months there is much to be grateful for and much more still to look forward to in this coming year.

In an unsettling and difficult 2020 there were many successes we are proud of. Within a few days of lockdown, we had planned and were providing virtual day services using a digital platform, offering rehabilitative virtual sessions. Underpinning this we had to ensure that all relevant policies and risk assessments were in place to support the new service provision and working practices.

Our fundraising events were all cancelled including their income and we were facing a £100,000 deficit. We responded with new ideas for fundraising campaigns and virtual fundraising events and are very grateful for the support of our Patron David Tennant who helped to boost engagement with our campaigns.

We were also fortunate that the government and many grant giving organisations were quick to react with opportunities to apply for emergency funding. As a result of fundraising and our cost saving efforts we expect to move from a deficit to hopefully a breakeven position at the end of our financial year, which is a real cause to celebrate amid a pandemic. We are bracing ourselves for 2021 now.

Through our social media feeds and website we were able to engage with supporters and service users providing vital information, advice, support and ideas for keeping motivated and active during the pandemic.

We took a big step towards securing our future sustainability when we at last took ownership of the Headway Centre in Colchester and we look forward to a time when we can properly celebrate this momentous occasion. Our special thanks to all our funders and particularly to the Catalyst Trust who were indeed a catalyst for this building purchase project.

Our work did not stop there as restrictions lifted and the virus came under control in the summer we were busy creating a COVID secure environment at our Headway Centre including adaptations, equipment and reconfigured offices and space. Sadly, with rising cases in Essex, we are currently closed again but we are sure it won't be long until we are welcoming our service users back.

So I look to 2021 and see only hope and a bright future of better days to come. Our Centres in both the North and South will reopen and our virtual services, that have proved so successful, will continue to run alongside the day centre activities. This provides more choice and flexibility for adults with acquired brain injury in Essex

Thank you all for your support and for taking the time to read our Newsletter. A happy, healthy and prosperous 2021 to you all.


Please stay safe and hopefully we will all see each other in person in the not to distant future.

To celebrate 35 years of supporting adults with acquired brain injury in the community, last November we launched our Christmas appeal.

With the pandemic continuing to have a direct impact on our ability to fundraise, our usual Christmas fundraising activities were unable to go ahead. So, we had to get creative and find another way to raise much-needed funds.

Facing a shortfall in our income this financial year, the Christmas 35 Campaign encouraged people to either donate or fundraise £35 or more to help us keep our day services running.

Our Patron, David Tennant supported the appeal, and a signed David Tennant card was offered to everyone who raised over £35 or more.



Reece Clarke's Amazing Story

In our latest client story, Reece Clarke tells his amazingly inspirational story of how his creativity and determination has helped him rebuild his life after brain injury.

"It was the evening of my late shift as a police special constable about 10 years ago, when a car crash on duty left me with a brain injury, which I still don't like to admit I have.

Some days I still feel like my old self, but mostly, I'm reminded by the wheelchair I am sitting in. I then get out of it, walk with my frame, go to the gym, cook, climb, laugh and more recently.... paint!

Therapies have become the norm and I would like to think I have made some good friends through my therapy team and support workers along the way. I go to physio three times per week, without fail and choose to live an active life as much as possible. I live for the gym and love swimming too. My OT generally gives me a good reason to chase my dreams and challenges me to better myself. I continue to fight for my own independence and beat the expectations that are assumed of me.

The Headway South Essex Hub has become like a second family to me. A place where I feel understood by others who had suffered similar injuries to me. I completed the "Brain Injury and Me" course, which provided useful tools and techniques to compensate for the effects of my brain injury.

I also attend the social support groups where I was able to practise my presentation skills, through giving a talk about my experience and some of my projects.

My creativity stems from my days as a musician and saxophonist. I was a member of a jazz band and lived for the improvisation solos. I also seemed to have a way with humour and this has thankfully not left me. Since the accident, I had to say farewell to certain things, like being able to arrest people. Although technically, I still can, just need the cuffs, so watch yourselves!


I started rock climbing as part of my therapy in 2016. It wasn't long before I was hooked and started a climbing

group, called "Project Climb". This group is still going at The Lock in Harlow, focussing on accessible climbing for young people who have sustained a head injury.

I have also embraced my quirky way with words and completed an advanced creative writing course, enjoying writing dark thrillers and humorous short stories.

Like for many of us, lockdown hit hard and robbed me of much that I enjoy doing. However, it has also benefitted me in that I had to look at the half full rather than half empty glass. I have always felt that creative activities stimulated my mind and soul. I started to explore painting.


It all started with the birth of my beautiful niece, Amelia and me wanting to paint for her. The first was a series of acrylic tulips. It took a few practices; however, they were all pretty great in the end. I received some requests from close family and friends with demands for paintings rolling in. I had to think carefully about my techniques and equipment due to the muscle tone in my hands. I discovered some great tutorials from professional artists online, who I could learn from and discovered my own style. I am working towards being able to attend more art workshops and courses once lockdown has lifted.



My highlight (and biggest challenge) was a commission piece to paint the cover of a Capability Brown album. The funds are being donated to Headway Essex (South Essex Hub) for their support, services and friendliness! However, as much as I stressed about it, it always works out in the end.

P.S Officially, I am still a copper, but without the handcuffs, so watch out!"


