News on Groups

Brain Injury and Me (BIAM) is our eight-week brain injury education programme for people with acquired brain injury. We have a group currently running, and it covers all aspects of brain injury. It helps people to understand why their injury has impacted areas of their life and to develop strategies to overcome some of the impact. Following feedback from our Carer's Forum we are developing a similar programme for family members too. Please let us know if you are interested in either course.

Our South Essex day centre, which opened this year, continues to grow and in January we will be opening an additional day. As a result of this growth and an internal promotion we are recruiting new team members and new volunteers. Client Story

Thanks to Headway Essex I have my children with me this Christmas

A brain injury can happen to anyone and lives are changed in an instant, but for some even with rehabilitation, the affects can last a lifetime. People like Leigh, this is her story she would like to share with you.

I was desperate to leave hospital, get back to my children and on with my life

"When I had my accident, whilst my broken bones were fixed, no one including me really considered my broken brain. I guess because I have no memory of the accident, then in one way it didn't happen to me. This helped create a short term method to deny my injuries, bury them and get on with life. I struggled to admit to myself that I had been affected by brain injury. I saw people being helped by charities, but back then I was too proud and also just couldn't find the courage to ask for help"

Asking for help was a brave thing for me to do

"At Headway Essex the staff listen, help and do not judge. They are here for me when I need it most. It is a safe space and supportive community. Headway Essex has helped me understand loss and in its own way, this has helped me process the sudden death of my husband five years ago.

I have isolated myself at times, due to tiredness; I'm just not able to do the things that I used to. Headway Essex helped me realise I'm not

alone. In 2020 Leigh recounts: "I received a call from social services telling me that they were holding an emergency meeting to consider taking my children away. I was devastated and could not think where to turn.

How would I cope, or face the future?

"I was distraught at the thought of losing my children and my mother's instinct kicked in, I called Headway Essex. I had only just begun working with them, but everyone was so supportive and understood that my brain injury affected every part of my life. They calmed me down and immediately contacted social services, explaining that we needed support to stay together as a family, particularly as my children already had to cope with the death of their father in 2017. Headway Essex advocated for me, helping me to get mine and my children's voices heard.

We have the support we need to keep on track

"I now go to the Headway Essex support group, I have a brain injury card, that I show to people when I need a bit more understanding, or time. Doing the brain injury education programme with Headway Essex, helped me enormously to understand my life now a bit more and in turn helped my children. Together we put strategies in place to help me manage my home, my life and my family. We have the support we need to keep on track. Working with Headway Essex and having them advocate for us all, has kept my family together. If it wasn't for them I'd be facing this Christmas, and every one to come, without my children. I am eternally grateful to have my family beside me, grounding me and growing into lovely people in front of my eyes, we are all much happier now."
